2017 Book of the Year Announcement



The Academy of Parish Clergy, Inc. proudly announces that the 2017 Book of the Year Award is awarded to *Reviving Old Scratch: Demons and the Devil for Doubters and the Disenchanted*, written by Richard Beck and published by Fortress Press (2016). Beck is Professor of Psychology at Abilene Christian University. The Book of the Year Award is given to the best book published for parish ministry in the previous year. In addition, the Reference Book of the Year Award is awarded to *1 Samuel as Christian Scripture: A Theological Commentary*, written by Stephen B. Chapman and published by William B. Eerdmans Publishing Co. (2016). Chapman is Associate Professor of Old Testament at Duke Divinity School and Director of Graduate Studies in Religion at Duke University.
